SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Pope Francis has proclaimed the 3rd Sunday of the Year "a Sunday entirely dedicated to the Word of God, in order to grasp the inexhaustible riches which, flow from the dialogue between God and his people". The best way to learn from the Bible, whose teaching is perennially relevant to the people of God, is to read it and reflect on it, receive it. In a time where some speak of a "post truth" society, one in which "alternative facts" and "fake news" are the order of the day, we know "that the word of God is alive" (Heb.4:12): "it does not die nor does it age; it abides for ever. It stays young in the presence of all that passes away (cf Matt.24:35) and protects from interior aging those who put it into practice. It is alive and it is life-giving" (Pope Francis)

Practical things to do:

- Read and reflect on the Sunday Scriptures before coming to Mass (this is prayer); or come a little early to Sunday Mass, and using the Sunday Missal, quietly read through the Readings before Mass begins;
- During the week think back to the Sunday Mass and recall the scriptures you heard reflect for a moment on any sentence or thought that made an impact on you at that time:
- During Lent, the Psalms will be prayed in Morning Prayer, Monday Friday at 7.30am in St Brigid's. Can you come, if not every morning, occasionally?
- Volunteer to read the Word of God at Sunday Mass
