Gaza/ Israel conflict; 15,000+ deaths (many children) – 1.7m Gazans out of 2.3m displaced.

Ukraine/Russia War; 500,000+ casualties.

Approximately a quarter of the world's population, two billion people, are currently living in conflict areas, in conditions that create risks of **human trafficking**.

27.6m trafficked persons – USA a top destination, among largest consumers of **child sex**, **a \$150 billion per year business**.

According to World Health Organisation, every year in the world there are an estimated 40-50 million abortions - one baby every two and a half minutes.

10 million preborn babies aborted in Britain since 1967 – 1 in 4 pregnancies end in abortion.

Legal abortions in the Republic of Ireland: 15 in 2017, 8,156 in 2022 (1 in 7 babies) Northern Ireland; 4,136 abortions since March 2020

More than 350 million people around the world have a legal right to die.
