According to World Health Organisation, every year in the world there are an estimated **40-50 million abortions**. This corresponds to approximately **125,000 abortions per day**.

Wednesday 27th October 2021, 54th anniversary of the **1967 Abortion Act**. Since then **9,789,238 babies aborted in England, Wales and Scotland – in 2020 more than one baby lost to abortion every two and a half minutes.**


At the end of 2020, there were 82.4 million forcibly displaced people in the world, double the 2010 figure.

Among them are **26.4 million refugees** (cross national boundary), around half of whom are **under the age of 18.**

According to the latest report on forced labour by the International Labour Organisation, an estimated **40.3 million** victims are trapped in **modern-day slavery**.

Legal abortions in the Republic of Ireland: 15 in 2017, 32 in 2018, 6,666 in 2019, 6577 in 2020. In Northern Ireland, 1345 abortions have taken place since March 31, 2020.

Bills which aim to legalise assisted dying have been introduced both in Westminster and the Dail.

Bambinelli Sunday

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday - a day to rejoice in the Lord. During his pontificate, St John Paul II chose this day to start a new Advent tradition which he called "Bambinelli Sunday". Bambinelli is the Italian word that means, "Little Baby Jesus". Pope John Paul II invited all the Romans to come to St Peter's Square with the Christ Jesus from their home crib, after the Angelus, everyone held up their baby Jesus and he blessed them. The children especially enjoy this tradition, which both Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have continued.

On Sunday 12th of December, we will have Bambinelli Sunday at St. Brigid's. At the Vigil and Sunday Masses, we will bless your figures of Baby Jesus that we encourage you to bring with you to Mass from your home crib. Following the blessing, take your Bambinelli home, gift wrap it and save it for Christmas. Let this be the first gift your family opens on Christmas, when you place your Baby Jesus in the crib - this celebration is especially enjoyable for the children of the parish, young and old!

The Synod on Synodality: Preparing to journey together

Pope Francis has called the entire People of God to journey together! This invitation isn't just for Bishops or Clergy it is an invitation to every Baptised person – all the People of God. The Synodal process invites each one of us - the People of God - to recall that we journey together as a community of faith. As we walk on our journey of faith we are called to listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit and to one another.

On this second week of Advent, we reflect on John the Baptist; a voice calling in the wilderness. There are many people who feel that their voice is in the wilderness and isn't heard by the Church. This week let us prayerfully look around our Parish Community and reflect on whose voice may not be heard and how we might accompany people on their faith journey with the compassion, love, and mercy that Jesus asks of us. This week we encourage you to pray with this prayer:

Lord, this Advent, give me a welcoming heart. Let me be open to the messengers of your word, especially to those whom at first glance I might resist, for they are your prophets today urging me to change my way of thinking and living.



Guidelines for attending Mass in St Brigid's

- Face Coverings must be worn when entering and exiting the church and should be worn throughout services.
- Current seating occupancy of the church is 275
- Observe social distancing and use the sanitizer at the Church Entrance;
- Take a seat and remain there until the end of Mass; children must remain with their parents, and in the seat, at all times;
- Do not sit beside anyone who is not a member of your household;
- To receive Holy Communion, remain in your seat and Holy Communion will be brought to you; Holy Communion is to be received in the hand;
- When leaving the Church follow the instructions and leave according to the indicated "One-way" system;
- Anyone with cold-like symptoms or coughs must not enter the Church;
- Those with under lying health issues are advised to remain at home;
- Toilet facilities are not available;
