#### **CARING FOR OUR COMMON HOME**

This Lent many of us will be giving something up, but it would be meaningful if we could relate this to reducing our carbon emissions which are generated by fossil fuels.

I probably do not need to tell you that we are in a dire environmental crisis. We now know that last year was the warmest year in over 100,000 years. This affects us all and it is humbling to learn that faith groups are already coming together in Northern Ireland to explore a joint approach for addressing environmental challenges, in order to enhance mutual support and develop a collaborative approach for the future.


Faith communities have an important part to play so together with the leadership of all the churches in South Belfast we are going to hold a series of 4 learning and discussion sessions over 4 Tuesday's in Lent – 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> February and 5<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> March at 7.30pm. In order to make these as accessible as possible we have arranged to hold the meetings in The Conference Centre, Newforge Sports Complex, 18b Newforge Lane, Belfast BT9 5NW.

We will publish the underlying themes for the four sessions in advance during next week and although the primary foundation is based on the 2015 encyclical letter by Pope Francis it must be stressed that this was written for everyone as caring for our common home is something we can all do together.

Further details will be published next Sunday, and I would urge people to attend to learn how to connect our respective faiths with actions on the climate crisis.

When this Chaplet is said in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as a judge but as a Merciful Saviour.
