At 12 noon Mass on Sunday 18th December, we are having our very own Bambinelli Sunday at St. Brigid's. Fr O'Donnell along with the Gift Group are inviting all our wonderful children and young people with their families to bring their figures of Baby Jesus to Mass from their home crib for a very special blessing.

Bambinelli Sunday was a tradition started by St John Paul II. Bambinelli is the Italian word that means, "Little Baby Jesus". Pope John Paul II invited all the Romans to come to St Peter's Square with the Christ Jesus from their home crib, everyone held up their baby Jesus and he blessed them. The children especially enjoy this tradition, which both Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have continued.

During 12 noon Mass, Fr O'Donnell will bless the Bambinelli that you have brought from your home. Following the blessing, take your Bambinelli home, gift wrap it, place it under your tree and save it for Christmas Day. "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you..." Jeremiah 1:5

The Parish Pastoral Council have organised a **"Day for Life" in St Brigid's Church**, beginning at the noon Mass on Saturday 10th December and ending at the noon Mass on Sunday 11th December.

It is a day of prayer that our society will respect, protect, love and serve life from the moment of conception until its natural end.

Everyone in the parish is invited to make a special effort to play a part in this day.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Saint Joseph, Saint John Paul II, Saint Maximilian Kolbe and Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta intercede for us.

According to World Health Organisation, every year in the world there are an estimated 40-50 million abortions. This corresponds to approximately 125,000 abortions per day.

Since the introduction of abortion in 1967, a staggering 9,900,961 preborn babies have lost their lives to abortion across England, Wales, and Scotland. In 2020, more than one baby was lost to abortion every two and a half minutes; 25 lives were ended every hour. Over 1 in 4 pregnancies in England and Wales now end in abortion.

By the end of 2021, the number displaced by war, violence, persecution and human rights abuses stood at 89.3 million.


49.6 million people were living in **modern slavery in 2021**, of which **27.6 million** were **in forced labour** and **22 million** in **forced marriage**.

Legal abortions in the Republic of Ireland: 15 in 2017, 32 in 2018, 6,666 in 2019, 6577 in 2020, 4,577 in 2021.

In Northern Ireland, 4th May 2022: **2,550 abortions** since March 2020. More than **350 million people** around the world have a legal right to die. Bills which aim to legalise assisted dying have been introduced both in Westminster and the Dail.
