Christmas Masses in St Brigid's Parish


Christmas 2021 will be a quite different Christmas! To avoid the real possibility of increased transmission of Covid-19 this Christmas, please note the following:

- There will be five Masses in the Parish for Christmas: four in St Brigid's, and one in the Catholic Chaplaincy. Those attending Mass must wear facecoverings while in the Church. This is to be scrupulously observed (with legitimate exceptions).
- Indoor Masses will be Live streamed at: 5.00pm and 9.00 pm on Christmas Eve and 9.30 am and 12 noon on Christmas Day.
- The Catholic Chaplaincy will have mass at 5.00 pm on Christmas Eve, There is convenient car parking. These Masses are very suitable for older parishioners and those attending Mass on their own. This is not suitable for family groups and children are not permitted in the Chaplaincy. The capacity of the Chaplaincy is 120. <u>Tickets only</u> for this Mass through Eventbrite: https://www.eventbrite.co.uk/e/223293194957 (Tickets available to book from 2pm on Sunday 19th December)
- In St. Brigid's there will be one outdoor family Mass in the Church Carpark on Christmas Eve at 7.00pm. There will be no cars permitted in the Carpark. There will be no seating come expecting to stand and come prepared for the weather. Stewards will guide parishioners to a safe place, please co-operate with the stewards. Although this mass is outdoors, it is recommended that face coverings are worn. Mass will be last approximately 35 minutes. Family groups, particularly with children, are encouraged to come to this Mass. A sound system will be installed in the grounds.
- There will also be Mass in St Brigid's Church at 9.00 pm on Christmas Eve, and at 9.30 am and 12 noon on Christmas Day the capacity of the Church is 275.
 Those unable to get into the Church can follow Mass, on their devices from outside. There will be no tickets or bookings for these masses.

In the present difficult circumstances, every effort has been made to do what is possible to ensure that the beautiful Feast of Christmas is celebrated in our parish. A risk assessment has been professionally carried out to ensure that the parish adheres to the guidance issued by the Public Health Agency and the NI Executive Directives. With the cooperation of everyone, we can celebrate Christmas safely.

The Synod on Synodality: Preparing to speak boldly and listen humbly

On this Gaudete Sunday as we pray with the Gospel we are reminded of our Baptism – a Baptism of the Holy Spirit, the same Holy Spirit that came upon the apostles at Pentecost. As we consider the synodal journey we are embarking on we do so with the courage and joy of the Holy Spirit.

Parrhesia refers to the boldness that the coming of the Holy Spirit brought about in the hearts of the apostles at Pentecost. It is the inner courage that sent them out to proclaim the Good News that Jesus is Lord without fear in the days of the Early Church. The Spirit offers us this same boldness to carry out the mission of the Church today. Parrhesia is required in the Synodal Process so that we can speak boldly and listen humbly. This week we encourage you to pray with this prayer:

Heavenly Father we ask that we become attentive to the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. May we be faithful witnesses to the Holy Spirit at work in our lives. May the fruits of the Spirit; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control be evident in our lives and in the Church's synodal journey. Amen



Guidelines for attending Mass in St Brigid's

- Face Coverings must be worn when entering and exiting the church and should be worn throughout services.
- Current seating occupancy of the church is 275
- Observe social distancing and use the sanitizer at the Church Entrance;
- Take a seat and remain there until the end of Mass; children must remain with their parents, and in the seat, at all times;
- Do not sit beside anyone who is not a member of your household;
- To receive Holy Communion, remain in your seat and Holy Communion will be brought to you; Holy Communion is to be received in the hand;
- When leaving the Church follow the instructions and leave according to the indicated "One-way" system;
- Anyone with cold-like symptoms or coughs must not enter the Church;
- Those with under lying health issues are advised to remain at home;
- Toilet facilities are not available;
