Christmas Masses in St Brigid's Parish

Christmas 2021 will be a quite different Christmas! To avoid the real possibility of increased transmission of Covid-19 this Christmas, please note the following:

- **There will be five Masses in the Parish for Christmas:** four in St Brigid's, and one in the Catholic Chaplaincy. Those attending Mass **must wear face-coverings** while in the Church. This is to be scrupulously observed (with legitimate exceptions).
- **Indoor Masses will be Live streamed** at: 5.00pm and 9.00 pm on Christmas Eve and 9.30 am and 12 noon on Christmas Day.
- **The Catholic Chaplaincy: 5.00 pm on Christmas Eve,** There is convenient car parking. This Mass is very suitable for older parishioners and those attending Mass on their own. **As children are not permitted in the Chaplaincy, this would not be suited for families groups.**
The capacity of the Chaplaincy is 120. **Tickets only for this Mass through Eventbrite:** <https://www.eventbrite.co.uk/e/223293194957>
(Tickets available to book from 2pm on Sunday 19th December)
- **In St. Brigid's there will be one outdoor family Mass in the Church Carpark on Christmas Eve at 7.00pm.** There will be no cars permitted in the Carpark. There will be no seating - come expecting to stand and come prepared for the weather. Stewards will guide parishioners to a safe place, please co-operate with the stewards. Although this Mass is outdoors, it is recommended that face coverings are worn. Mass will be last approximately 35 minutes. Family groups, particularly with children, are encouraged to come to this Mass. A sound system will be installed in the grounds.
- There will also be Mass in St Brigid's Church at 9.00 pm on Christmas Eve, and at 9.30 am and 12 noon on Christmas Day – the capacity of the Church is 275. Those unable to get into the Church can follow Mass, on their devices from outside. *There will be no tickets or bookings for these masses.*

In the present difficult circumstances, every effort has been made to do what is possible to ensure that the beautiful Feast of Christmas is celebrated in our parish. A risk assessment has been professionally carried out to ensure that the parish adheres to the guidance issued by the Public Health Agency and the NI Executive Directives. With the cooperation of everyone, we can celebrate Christmas safely.

The Synod on Synodality: Preparing to listen

Pope Francis has affirmed that: "A synodal Church is a Church which listens. The faithful People, the Bishops, all listening to each other; and all listening to the Holy Spirit." Listening from a place of prayer is the foundation of our synodal process, and it requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice.



As pilgrims on this synodal journey we recognise that no one person has the answer and that through authentic listening everyone has something to learn. The faithful people, the college of bishops, the Bishop of Rome: all listening to each other, and all listening to the Holy Spirit.

This week we pray that we will be a listening church; listening to the Holy Spirit prompting the Church to be attentive to the missionary dream of God's love reaching everyone and inspired by God's love that we reach out to care for all humanity.

This week we invite you to pray;

Come Holy Spirit, Make our ears to hear, make our eyes to see, make our mouths to speak, make our hearts to seek, make our hands to reach out and touch the world with your love. Amen.

Guidelines for attending Mass in St Brigid's

- **Face Coverings** must be worn when entering and exiting the church and should be worn throughout services.
- Current seating occupancy of the church is **275**
- Observe social distancing and use the sanitizer at the Church Entrance;
- Take a seat and remain there until the end of Mass; children must remain with their parents, and in the seat, at all times;
- Do not sit beside anyone who is not a member of your household;
- To receive Holy Communion, remain in your seat and Holy Communion will be brought to you; Holy Communion is to be received in the hand;
- When leaving the Church follow the instructions and leave according to the indicated "One-way" system;
- *Anyone with cold-like symptoms or coughs must not enter the Church;*
- Those with underlying health issues are advised to remain at home;
- Toilet facilities are not available;
