Social Distancing

Parishes may remove measures put in place to ensure social distancing, such as closed off pews.

The Church will be open all day for private prayer from Monday 20th February.

Face Coverings

The Diocese strongly recommends that face coverings be worn at all times while in the church and throughout liturgical celebrations, even when seated.

Hand Sanitisers

Hand sanitisers will continue to be provided at the entrances and other appropriate points in the Church.

Holy Water Fonts, missalettes, bulletins etc.

For the time being, holy water fonts will remain empty.

Sick-calls and First-Friday Visits

There is no restriction on making emergency or routine pastoral visits. Priests and other ministers should continue to exercise caution when undertaking sick-calls and making visits to the sick and housebound. All mitigations, such as face coverings and good hand hygiene should continue to be observed as previously advised.

The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holydays remains suspended at this time.

An Invitation

Pope Francis has invited us to come together to reflect on our experience of Church, and to share on matters of faith. This coming together is called "synodality". The idea of synodality comes from the word 'synod.' an old word from the Greek speaking world — syn means with, and odos means a path — and simply means "journeying together". Synodality is a path or a journey that the People of God take with each other. In this synodal pathway the Pope asks that we all take our part and make our own contribution. He says to us:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,
we need the Spirit, the ever new breath of God,
who sets us free from every form of self-absorption,
revives what is moribund,
loosens shackles and spreads joy.
The Holy Spirit guides us to where God wants us to be,
not to where our own ideas
and personal tastes would lead us.

On this synodal pathway we are all invited to reflect on two key questions

- How is this "journeying together" happening in our particular situation?
- What steps does the Holy Spirit invite us to undertake in order to grow in our journey together?

The purpose of journeying together is not about producing more documents rather:

Planting dreams
having a vision
allowing hope to flourish
inspiring trust binding wounds
weaving together relationships
awakening a new dawn
learning from one another
creating a bright resourcefulness
that will



enlighten our minds, warm our hearts, and give strength to our hands

Beginning a Conversation

We begin our journey together, by initiating a conversation, and by asking you to provide some basic information, and to reflect on some questions as you do so.
