
We will be distributing these in the coming weeks to families known to us, who are experiencing financial difficulty and the related stress that comes with the pressures of providing at Christmas.

Please leave vouchers with any member of the SVP, drop them in the offertory baskets or leave them into the Parish Office with Lisa (Secretary).


Vouchers need to be left in by the weekend of 3rd/4th December to allow us to distribute these to families before Christmas.

Day for Life

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you..."

The Parish Pastoral Council have organised a **"Day for Life" in St Brigid's Church, beginning at the noon Mass on Saturday 10th December and ending at the noon Mass on Sunday 11th December.**

It is a day of prayer that our society will respect, protect, love and serve life from the moment of conception until its natural end.

Everyone in the parish is invited to make a special effort to play a part in this day.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Saint Joseph, Saint John Paul II, Saint Maximilian Kolbe and Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta intercede for us.

"The innocent victim of abortion, children who die of hunger or from bombings, immigrants who drown in the search for a better tomorrow, the elderly or the sick who are considered a burden, the victims of terrorism, wars, violence and drug trafficking, the environment devastated by man's predatory relationship with nature: At stake in all of this is the gift of God, of which we are noble stewards but not masters."

According to World Health Organisation, **every year in the world there are an estimated 40-50 million abortions.** This corresponds to approximately **125,000 abortions per day.**

Since **the introduction of abortion in 1967**, a staggering **9,900,961 preborn babies have lost their lives to abortion across England, Wales, and Scotland.** In **2020**, more than **one baby was lost to abortion every two and a half minutes; 25 lives were ended every hour.**

Over 1 in 4 pregnancies in England and Wales now end in abortion.

By the end of **2021**, the number displaced by war, violence, persecution and human rights abuses stood at **89.3 million.**

49.6 million people were living in **modern slavery in 2021**, of which **27.6 million** were in **forced labour** and **22 million** in **forced marriage.**

Legal abortions in the **Republic of Ireland: 15 in 2017, 32 in 2018, 6,666 in 2019, 6577 in 2020, 4,577 in 2021.**

In **Northern Ireland**, 4th May 2022: **2,550 abortions** since March 2020.

More than **350 million people** around the world have a **legal right to die.**

Bills which aim to legalise assisted dying have been introduced both in Westminster and the Dail.

The Re-introduction of The Sign of Peace:

This is one of the most ancient gestures in the liturgy going right back to the early Church. By the Sign of Peace we publicly reverence Christ's presence in our neighbour before approaching the Altar, where we acknowledge Christ's presence in Holy Communion. Since Vatican 11 the Sign of Peace has been to exchange a "Hand-shake" with one's immediate neighbour, but since the outbreak of the pandemic that gesture has been suspended. However, as the importance of Sign of Peace cannot be overlooked, and it is essential that we have some gesture that signifies our union with Christ in the Eucharist and our respect for our neighbour. Therefore, **from the 1st Sunday in Advent (27th November) we shall re-introduce the Sign of Peace to the Mass**, but it will take a different form – It will not be expressed as a "Handshake", thus respecting health guidance. **The Sign of Peace will be exchanged by a simple bow towards the person closest to you** - it is not necessary to bow to everyone around you in the Church as the immediate neighbour represents all.
