Christmas Collection 2020

Dear Parishioners,

At the beginning of 2020 no one could have foreseen the difficulties we would have to endure due to Covid-19. While our first thoughts must be with those who have died, and with their grieving families, we think also of the sick and elderly in our care homes and in our hospitals. They, though admirably cared for by hard pressed medical and nursing staffs, are, nevertheless, isolated from their families. Many others have been "cocooned" in their own homes and depending on the goodwill of relatives and neighbours. At the same time, the restriction on the numbers attending our churches – while very understandable – is not without its pain. As priests, we too struggle with all of this, and experience the sadness and frustration of not being able to minister to our parishioners as we would want, yet, we continue to do what is possible in the circumstances.

The pandemic has caused a downturn in the economic situation and once healthy businesses have reduced their staff, or in some cases, closed altogether. Consequently, many families will face this Christmas with greatly reduced, or even no, income. As a result, parish income is greatly reduced, as is the income of priests, who rely entirely on the voluntary contributions of parishioners. Of course, in this time of financial worry, the upkeep of the priests must be secondary to the particular needs of parishioners and those of their families. Nevertheless, if your circumstances permit, we ask that you please keep your priests in mind this Christmas.

The traditional Christmas collection, together with the other collections for the upkeep of priests throughout the year, is, in a spirit of priestly fraternity, "pooled" in a central fund. This fund, administered by an elected committee of priests, is shared in such a way as to ensure that every priest ministering in the Diocese receives the same level of income.

Thank you for your kind support and your constant prayers. We pray, that even in these difficult times, Christmas may be for you a time of blessing.

Christmas Masses in St Brigid's Parish 2020

Christmas 2020 will be a quite different Christmas! To avoid the real possibility of increased transmission of Covid-19 this Christmas, please note the following:

- The obligation to attend Mass in person this Christmas has been suspended. Those who are physically frail and / or susceptible to illness, young or old, are strongly advised to remain at home and follow Mass online. Christmas Masses will be streamed at: 9.00 pm on Christmas Eve; 9.30 am and 12 noon on Christmas Day. Parishioners can also attend Mass on one of the days over the Christmas season up to the Feast of the Epiphany, 6th January thus avoiding the larger congregations.
- There will be eight Masses in the Parish for Christmas: five in St Brigid's, and three in the Catholic Chaplaincy. Those attending Mass at Christmas must wear face-covering while in the Church grounds as well as in Church. This is to be scrupulously observed (with legitimate exceptions).
- Social distancing must be observed, and children must remain always in the company of their parents no moving about. Social distancing must not breakdown at the end of Mass please leave the Church grounds immediately after Mass and avoid gathering in groups. It cannot be emphasized enough how essential it is to observe these norms.
- The Masses in The Catholic Chaplaincy are: 5.00 pm and 7.00 pm on Christmas Eve, and 10.00 am on Christmas Day. There is convenient car parking. These Masses are very suitable for older parishioners and those attending Mass on their own. They are not suitable for family groups and children are not permitted in the Chaplaincy. The capacity of the Chaplaincy is 120.
- In St. Brigid's there will be two outdoor Masses in the Church Carpark on Christmas Eve at 6.00 pm and 7.30 pm. There will be no cars permitted in the Carpark. There will be no seating come expecting to stand and come prepared for the weather. Stewards will guide parishioners to a safe place, please co-operate with the stewards.

Face-coverings must be worn, and social distancing strictly observed. Each Mass will be last approximately 35 minutes. Family groups,

particularly with children, are encouraged to comes to one or other of these Masses. A sound system will be installed in the grounds.

• There will also be Mass in **St Brigid's Church at 9.00 pm on Christmas Eve,** and at 9.30 am and 12 noon on Christmas Day – the capacity of the Church is 120. Those unable to get into the Church can follow Mass, on their devices from outside.

In the present difficult circumstances, every effort has been made to do what is possible to ensure that the beautiful Feast of Christmas is celebrated in our parish. A risk assessment has been professionally carried out to ensure that the parish adheres to the guidance issued by the Public Health Agency and the NI Executive Directives. With the cooperation of everyone, we can celebrate Christmas safely.

Parishioners from neighboring parishes, while normally welcome to St Brigid's, are asked, in this exceptionally difficult year, to take part in the Christmas Celebrations in their own parishes.
