## **Day for Life**

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you..."

Jeremiah 1:5

The Parish Pastoral Council have organised a "Day for Life" in St Brigid's Church, beginning at the noon Mass on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> December and ending at the noon Mass on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> December.

It is a day of prayer that our society will respect, protect, love and serve life from the moment of conception until its natural end.

Everyone in the parish is invited to make a special effort to play a part in this day.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Saint Joseph, Saint John Paul II, Saint Maximilian Kolbe and Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta intercede for us.

"The innocent victim of abortion, children who die of hunger or from bombings, immigrants who drown in the search for a better tomorrow, the elderly or the sick who are considered a burden, the victims of terrorism, wars, violence and drug trafficking, the environment devastated by man's predatory relationship with nature: At stake in all of this is the gift of God, of which we are noble stewards but not masters."

According to World Health Organisation, every year in the world there are an estimated 40-50 million abortions. This corresponds to approximately 125,000 abortions per day.

Since the introduction of abortion in 1967, a staggering 9,900,961 preborn babies have lost their lives to abortion across England, Wales, and Scotland. In 2020, more than one baby was lost to abortion every two and a half minutes; 25 lives were ended every hour.

Over 1 in 4 pregnancies in England and Wales now end in abortion.

By the end of 2021, the number displaced by war, violence, persecution and human rights abuses stood at 89.3 million.

**49.6 million** people were living in **modern slavery in 2021**, of which **27.6 million** were **in forced labour** and **22 million** in **forced marriage**.

Legal abortions in the Republic of Ireland: 15 in 2017, 32 in 2018, 6,666 in 2019, 6577 in 2020, 4,577 in 2021.

In Northern Ireland, 4<sup>th</sup> May 2022: **2,550 abortions** since March 2020.

More than 350 million people around the world have a legal right to die.

Bills which aim to legalise assisted dying have been introduced both in Westminster and the Dail.
