Eye Surgery in Rwanda Date for your diary

Monday 13th May 2024 at 7.45pm in the Parish Centre

Three of our parishioners Doctors Olivia Earley, Noemi Lois and Augusto Blanco recently spent time in the Eye Unit in Kabgayi Hospital in Rwanda teaching doctors to perform cataract and other eye surgery techniques.

They were there at the invitation of Dr Michael Mikail, an ophthalmic consultant who trained in Belfast, and is now working in the Kabgayi Hospital. He is the only retinal consultant for a population of 11 million people.

Everyone is warmly invited to a presentation on 13 May about the trip and future plans to help in training doctors.
