St Brigid's Parish and preparation for Christmas

The pandemic has restricted parish life for the last number of months, yet, in spite of all, a great deal of pastoral work has continued. Through the Parish Website and Facebook, we have striven to maintain contact with everyone, and now our Webcam facilities are greatly helping in this endeavour. Many are wondering what this Christmas will be like, so here is a brief outline of the Parish outreach for the Christmas Season.

- The response to the collection for the **Foodbank** has been amazing! To date **£5503** + **€200** has been donated. *(notice opposite)*
- The St Vincent de Paul Christmas Appeal is underway again the response is extraordinary. Gifts of money and gift-card vouchers are coming in every day.
- The Parish cooperated with the Catholic Chaplaincy at Queens for the **Homeless Shoebox Appeal**. The parishioners, together with others from the University and the wider community, have left in a huge number of beautifully prepared shoeboxes and gift-bags to the Chaplaincy. The Parish Youth Faith Group prepared 50+ shoeboxes!
- Another initiative of the Catholic Chaplaincy was to prepare Student Care Packs. They will be distributed to International Students unable to travel home for Christmas. Some members of our Parish Youth Faith Group helped to pack two thousand Care Packs!
- The boys and girls of our **Parish GIFT programme** (Growing In Faith Together) are writing to and preparing little Christmas gifts for nominated parishioners who have been shielding. (See full notice below)
- The Parish and the Chaplaincy have cooperated in producing "Nine lessons and Carols". This will be available on our Parish Website before Christmas.

We know that many people in our Parish regardless of age are feeling lonely and sad; disconnected from our wonderful parish community.

This Christmas the young people from our Parish GIFT programme would like to send out a message of love, hope and connection. They wish to deliver a GIFT package and a handwritten note and Christmas card to anyone in the Parish that is finding it hard, especially those shielding and therefore housebound. In order to do this, **WE NEED YOUR HELP**.

Can you please send into the Parish Office the name and address of anyone you think would welcome this gesture from our young people. Please make sure you have their permission, and they are happy for you to share their details. We will also need your details too!

Please note the nomination can be any age and you can send in more than one.

We will match a GIFT young person to one of the nominated people. There will be a commitment by the young person to pray especially for their nominated person during Advent.

On the 4th weekend in Advent the young person from GIFT will deliver their gift and note to the home of their designated person. The gift will be left off at the door and if possible, a socially distanced chat can take place. If your nominated person cannot come to the door, please bring this to our attention.

We have suffered such disconnection from one another since March. It would be wonderful to make some connection across all age ranges in the run up to Christmas. Please do join in.

If you are not on the already established GIFT WhatsApp groups and would like to join in please do not hesitate to get in touch. We had such fun with the GIFT chain of connection earlier in lockdown. The young people as ever, were inspirational.

Praying the Mass via Technology

As so many parishioners are joining in live broadcasts of Sunday, and weekday, Mass it might be helpful to consciously think about how we go about participating in them. These suggestions for praying the Mass via technology may be helpful:

- Dress as you would for Mass
- Have your technology ready and be on time.
- Turn off any technology that might distract you during the Mass.
- If possible, join in the Mass as a family and have a member light a candle before Mass begins, perhaps beside a cross or another sacred image.
- Share in the responses, prayers, and gestures of the Mass.
- Stand for the Gospel and Our Father; kneel as appropriate if you can; share some sign of peace if you are with others.
- Join in the singing.
- At the time of Holy Communion, make an act of spiritual communion.
- And finally, when Mass is ended go in peace from this prayer to live what you have prayed.

In these darkest of days, our keeping of Sunday can give us exactly the light, sustenance, and grace we need to carry us through the rest of our week. Sunday is God's gift to us. It is up to us to do the unwrapping.
