Praying the Mass via Technology

As so many parishioners are joining in live broadcasts of Sunday, and weekday, Mass it might be helpful to consciously think about how we go about participating in them. These suggestions for praying the Mass via technology may be helpful:

- Dress as you would for Mass
- Have your technology ready and be on time.
- Turn off any technology that might distract you during the Mass.
- If possible, join in the Mass as a family and have a member light a candle before Mass begins, perhaps beside a cross or another sacred image.
- Share in the responses, prayers, and gestures of the Mass.
- Stand for the Gospel and Our Father; kneel as appropriate if you can; share some sign of peace if you are with others.
- Join in the singing.
- At the time of Holy Communion, make an act of spiritual communion.
- And finally, when Mass is ended go in peace from this prayer to live what you have prayed.

In these darkest of days, our keeping of Sunday can give us exactly the light, sustenance, and grace we need to carry us through the rest of our week. Sunday is God's gift to us. It is up to us to do the unwrapping.

According to World Health Organisation, every year in the world there are an estimated 40-50 million abortions. This corresponds to approximately 125,000 abortions per day.

At least **79.5 million** people around the world have been forced to flee their homes. Among them are nearly **26 million refugees** (cross national boundary), around half of whom are **under the age of 18**.


According to the latest report on forced labour by the International Labour Organisation, an estimated **40.3 million** victims are trapped in **modern-day slavery**.

Legal **abortions** in the **Republic of Ireland**: 15 in 2017, 32 in 2018 and **6,666 in 2019**. In **Northern Ireland**, **664** abortions have taken place **since March 31, 2020**. A new bill which aims to **legalise assisted dying** has passed the first stage at the **Dáil**.

Mass in St. Brigid's Parish

Some things to keep in mind when attending Mass:

- FACE COVERINGS are mandatory when entering and exiting the church and should be worn throughout services.
- The seating capacity of the Church is 120;
- Observe social distancing and use the sanitizer at the Church Entrance;
- The Church doors are closed at one minute before Mass the Church cannot be entered once Mass begins;
- Take a seat and remain there until the end of Mass; children must remain with their parents, and in the seat, at all times;
- Do not sit beside anyone who is not a member of your household;
- For those who wish to receive Holy Communion, remain in your seat and Holy Communion will be brought to you; Holy Communion is to be received in the hand;
- When leaving the Church follow the instructions and leave according to the indicated "One-way" system;
- Anyone with cold-like symptoms must not enter the Church;
- Those with under lying health issues are advised to remain at home;
- Toilet facilities are not available;
- Holidaymakers returning from other countries should not attend mass for 2 weeks.
- Numbers attending Funerals and Weddings are now limited to 25 persons.
